Course Descriptions

"Acute & Peri-op Pain Management for Patients with OUD"

The Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) epidemic in the USA, the pharmacology and value of medications used in MOUD, the management of acute and peri-operative pain (pre-op & post-op) in OUD patients receiving MAT, and the management of acute pain in OUD patients not receiving MAT

"Buprenorphine in the ED: A Simple Life-Saving Treatment for a Lethal Medical Disease"

Fundamentals of OUD, pharmacology of buprenorphine, in depth literature view of buprenorphine as an effective ED intervention and developing standard of care, and guide to buprenorphine initiation in the ED

"Case Reviews of OUD in the ED and Hospital"

Interactive case discussion of management of real patients with complications of OUD

"Neurobiological Basis of Substance Use Disorders"

Substance Use Disorders (SUD) as chronic illnesses, the basic neurobiology of SUD, and how the neurobiology impacts the course, prognosis and treatments of SUD

"Nuts & Bolts' of Treatment for OUD in Clinic Setting"

This is an introduction to how to actually prescribe buprenorphine once you have your waiver. It will talk about the common concerns, such as what documentation you should do, what to do if your patient is struggling, and how to handle some disruptive behaviors.

Fundamentals of OUD, pharmacology of buprenorphine, and guide to buprenorphine initiation in the ED

"OUD in Pregnancy"

This talk describes how to manage patients with OUD when they become pregnant. It includes information about medication use during pregnancy, and some common problems associated with OUD in pregnancy. It also discusses the postpartum period and neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome.

"Responsible Opioid Prescribing"

Screening for addiction and monitoring for aberrant behavior in patients with chronic pain

"Stigma, Recovery, and the Use of Language"

Remission is possible! Substance Use Disorders remain some of the most stigmatized illness. Recognize stigmatizing language and learn the components of recovery, how stigma is a barrier to recovery, and what you can do to combat stigma and promote recovery.

Presenter Team

Eric Ketcham MD, MBA, FACEP, FASAM, FACHE, FAAEM is board certified in emergency medicine (ABEM) and addiction medicine (ABPM). He is co-founder and past chair of the Pain Management and Addiction Medicine Section of the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP). He works primarily for the Presbyterian Healthcare System (PHS), half-time as an emergency medicine physician, and half-time as an addiction medicine specialist (outpatient clinic and hospital consults – ICU, Med/Surg, L&D, ED, etc.). He was the co-chair for the development of the ACEP/AAAP X-waiver course. He has been initiating buprenorphine in the ED since 2011.

Leslie Hayes, MD, works for El Centro Family Health in Espanola, NM. She is board-certified in both addiction and family medicine. While Dr. Hayes enjoys all aspects of family medicine, her particular passion is taking care of people with opioid use disorder. She especially enjoys working with pregnant women and new mothers who have had drug problems and works hard to make sure that they and their babies receive compassionate and appropriate medical care. She was named a White House Champion of Change in April of 2016 for her work with substance use disorder and pregnancy.

Snehal Bhatt, MD, is an associate professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the University of New Mexico. He also serves as the Chief of Addiction Psychiatry at UNM. He provides his clinical services at a busy outpatient clinic treating over 850 individuals with complex substance use disorders and co-occurring psychiatric illnesses. He has also served as the Addictions Advisor for Indian Health Services, providing direct clinical care, consultations, and education nationally. Dr. Bhatt is funded by National Institutes on Drug Abuse to investigate strategies to improve treatment outcomes for individuals with Opioid Use Disorders, and to investigate a novel agent to treat opioid withdrawals. Additionally, he is currently involved in projects to build capacity to treat OUD within rural New Mexico, and to train all United States Public Health Service officers in the management of chronic pain and substance use disorders.
